Overview of Messaging Templates

This document is designed to help you introduce Ally to instructors and students. While you always want to tailor your messaging to your unique campus culture and strategy, below are some "Communication Keys," "Resources," and "Example Texts" to help you craft your message.

Faculty Messaging

Communication Keys:

- Emphasize how more accessible content and alternative formats can benefit <u>all</u> students
- Clearly state expectations around remediating accessibility issues with course content
- Explain where and how to reach out for support with file issues
- Describe the purpose of the Ally indicators and that they are <u>not</u> visible to students
- Emphasize that Ally does not affect their original course files in any way
