- Expand to more video providers (depending on API availability):
 - Vimeo: Currently in development
 - Kaltura: Currently in research
- Support embedded video content uploaded directly in LMS (not links) where available
 - Canvas: Currently in development (waiting on Canvas endpoint)
 - HTML5: Currently in development

History of Music

Although definitions of mu 1/2 wildly throughout the world, every known culture partakes in it, and



The music of prehistoric cultures is first firmly dated to c. 40,000 BP of the Upper Paleolithic by evidence of bone flutes, though it remains unclear whether or not the actual origins lie in the earlier Middle Paleolithic period (300,000 to 50,000 BP). There is little known about prehistoric music, with traces mainly limited to some simple flutes and percussion instruments. However, such evidence indicates that music existed to some extent in prehistoric societies such as the Xia dynasty and the civilization. Upon the development of writing, the music of literate civilizations—ancient music—was present in the major Chinese, Egyptian, Greek, Indian, Persian, Mesopotamian, and Middle Eastern societies. It is difficult to make many generalizations about ancient music as a whole, but from what is known it was often characterized by monophony and improvisation. In ancient song forms, the texts were closely aligned with




Suggest Alternative Text For Images Ally for LMS

Broken Link Checking Ally for LMS

- Apply Ally's accessibility check to determine which links within WYSIWYG content or HTML files are broken
- Provide feedback and guidance when the content linked is moved or removed





HTML Content Preview Ally for LMS and Ally for Websites

- Provide a preview within the feedback panel for specific accessibility issues
- Allows for better and easier identification of issues in the HTML content without having to pull up the HTML file separately

I have linked each author to his/her Wikipedia article, which will provide you with good basic information to help you make your choice.* Each student should pick and "claim" a different author. If you love an American author who is not on the list, write me an email and we will negotiate. Once you have selected your author and work(s), post your choices on the <u>Author Selection</u> discussion board. I will approve your choices there.

Once you have picked your author, select the work or works you would like to study. Please choose something you have not read before. If you are studying a poet, you should select at least three to six (3-6) poems (depending on length). If you are studying a fiction writer, you should study at least one to three (1-3) stories (depending on length) or a novel. If you are studying a playwright, you should study at least one (1) play.

You can get a copy of the work(s) you want to read in several different ways. Many of the older authors' works are online -- just Google and find them. Many of the works can be found at very inexpensive prices in used bookstores or online. If you have trouble finding what you need, write me an email and I'll help.

* I don't recommend using Wikipedia for your research, but it is fine for this basic information link.






HTML Code Preview Ally for Websites





- Provide an easy way for students to recall the original file if they need it for reference when working with Ally's Alternative Formats











Handwriting Recognition Support Ally for LMS








Domain Configuration Ally for Websites

 Ability to add and remove domains from the Ally for Web scan configuration without requiring additional help from support teams







Facilitate Integration with Reporting Tools

- Current API only supports downloading data files (CSV)
- New endpoint to get data in formats supported by reporting tools (e.g JSON files)
- Include sorting and filtering options
- Easy integration with Power BI and other reporting tools

- Expand your analysis of issue level data:
 - How many departments have Contrast image issues?
 - How many courses have HTML empty headers?
- Tailor your insight into the score:
 - 'All institution' reports
